Maritime Law introduces the legal framework that ship operates in the international business

environment. The aim of the course is to acquaint learners with the basic issues concerning the ship (ownership, use and operation), master, crew and maritime company, as well as the legal issues of the chartering. In particular, the emphasis is placed on the conceptual familiarization with the legal issues of Maritime Law. It is taught based on the latest developments at international level, follows international jurisprudence mainly of Anglo-Saxon law and adapts these developments to Greek law.

At the end of the course the learner will be expected to be able to:

- understand the basic principles and concepts of Maritime Law
- be aware of the historical evolution of Maritime Law institutions to date
- analyze the institutional development and operational data of Maritime Law at national and international level
- formulate and evaluate courses of action at a theoretical and practical level
